Speaker Served on 6 of 7 Continents

Captain J. M. Branch who currently serves as the Commanding Officer of Air Station Savannah, Ga., was born in a US Army hospital in Augsburg, West Germany in 1972.

Capt. Branch now has over 3,500 hours of flight experience, has served at six air stations and has been deployed to six of the seven continents.

He moved back to the States with his family in 1974 where he

spent most of his childhood just outside the gates of Air Station Houston. After four years of volunteer firefighting and watching the Coast Guard helicopters launch, he left for the Coast Guard Academy where he earned his bachelor's degree in Management in 1995.

From 1995 to 1997, Capt. Branch was stationed back home in Galveston, Texas aboard the US-CGC Dauntless (WMEC 624) as the First Lieutenant and Deck Watch Officer. The next stop was

Naval Air Station Pensacola where he earned his rotary aviator wings in 1998.

After flight school, Capt. Branch was assigned to Group/Air Station Port Angeles, Washington. There, he flew the HH-65A helicopter and earned designation as an Aircraft Captain. He was next transferred in 2002 to the Polar Operations Division at Aviation Training Center Mobile, Ala. where he deployed to Antarctica as part of AV-DET 157 aboard the USCGC POLAR SEA.

In 2003, Capt. Branch was selected for the Aviation Engineering program and was transferred to Air Station Traverse City, Mich. as the Assistant Engineering Officer. There, he qualified in HH-65B's as an Aircraft Captain, Instructor Pilot, and Flight Examiner.

From 2006 to 2008, he migrated west again to assume the duties of Aviation Engineering Officer for Air Station Los Angeles, Calif. During this tour, he qualified in the HH-65C and continued his duties as an Instructor pilot and Flight Examiner.

In 2008, Capt. Branch was selected to attend Texas A&M University where he earned his master's degree in Systems Engineering. After graduation, he was recruited to the newly formed DCMS-5, Mission Support Integration team at Coast Guard Headquarters (CGHQ) to help stand up the new modernization effort for the Coast Guard.


